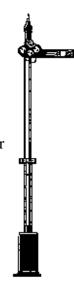
Two weeks later, we are off to Lynden for the Lynden Lions Club Model Train Show. The show's signup sheet will be in next month's Flimsy Board.

This depot was loosely based on a depot outside of St. Paul, MN. They made some changes from the original kit. The new kit has a wooden platform, random width and length shake shingles, and comes with benches. Kit includes: Laser-cut wood walls, laser-cut shake shingles, laser-cut roof supports, Tichy windows and door, scale 6' long benches (2), and easy to follow instructions. Structure dimension are: 3-3/4" x 2-1/2" Retail Price - \$35.00 Limited run of 50 kits.

Bay Window Caboose

As freight cars grew taller, observing a train from the cupola of a caboose became increasingly difficult. In the wooden car era, another problem with cupola cabooses was sagging roofs. To solve these problems, the Akron, Canton & Youngstown railroad introduced the bay window caboose in 1923. (In fact, however, bay windows had been used on New York & Harlem Railroad passenger cars as far back as the 1850s, to enable conductors to better anticipate station arrivals.) In 1930 the Baltimore & Ohio became the first railroad to adopt the bay window style

as its standard caboose; it never purchased another cupola model. During the same decade, the Milwaukee Road and the Northern Pacific built substantial bay window fleets as well. But it was immediately after World War II that the bay window design became widespread, as car heights increased significantly, and cupolas became less and less useful. As with diesels and other modern freight cars, these postwar bay window cabooses were part of the shift away from customized, railroad-specific locos and cars toward standardized designs produced in large quantities on efficient assembly lines. Key builders of bay window cabooses included International Car Company and American Car & Foundry.

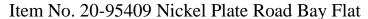

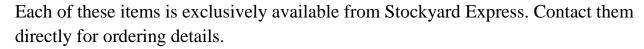

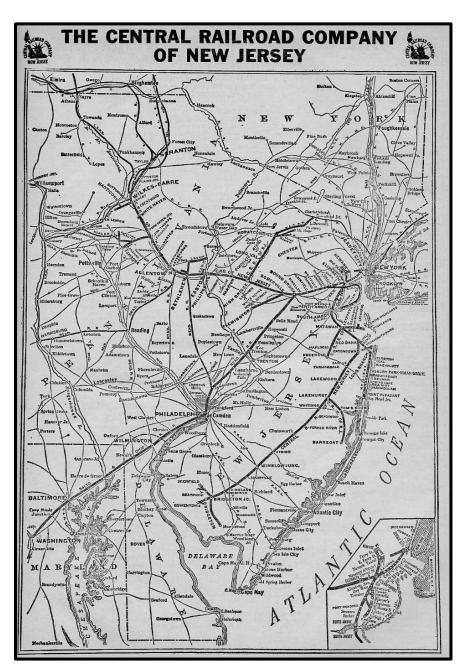
How many miles of track did the Central Railroad of New Jersey operate?

The Central Railroad of New Jersey has gone by several different names from CNJ to Jersey Central. Regardless of its many titles the CNJ was a New Jersey institution although it was only regional in operation and, at its peak, just 711 miles in length. The Jersey Central served much of its home state along with

northwestern Pennsylvania, Philadelphia, and Washington D.C. via a partnership with the Baltimore & Ohio. It also acquired a part of the old Lehigh & New England during the 1960s. The demise of the CNJ was the result of several factors including a region too saturated with railroads, stiff government regulation, and markets already served by more efficient competitors (such as the Pennsylvania and Reading). However, for all these setbacks the railroad was further burdened by heavy taxation through the state of New Jersey. These issues ultimately led to the railroad's bankruptcy



and inclusion into Conrail in 1976. Today, little remains of the old CNJ lines.
